




Laboratory Learning

Students come into university with a variety of laboratory experiences








Student Feedback


An online survey was developed with the aim of evaluating student familiarisation and preparation for the laboratory

218 responses (27% response rate)









Student comments:

"As a first year student, it was good to be able to virtually visit my lab class before the actual lab, so knew where everything was so I didn't have to stress during the actual assessed lab."


"Learning the environment I would be working in and where I could get my equipment from. This allowed me to walk into my lab on the first day and be confident, rather than spending lots of time familiarising myself with a foreign environment."



Future improvements:

"Would be nice if it could be worked into a prelab for the first lab session somehow. Kind of like a game, you follow similar steps to where you would actually go on your first lab by clicking on each station/point."

"Adding more information of where equipment maybe found for every individual experiment."



Bachelor of Biomedical Science

- New for 2018
- International and domestic demand for a bespoke health degree
- Incorporates health sciences majors, including Medical Sciences
- Total of 11 majors



Changes to the Bachelor of Arts

- Bachelor of Design has been rescinded
- Design majors are now incorporated into the Bachelor of Arts
- Architecture to become a double major
- Integrated Design rescinded



Prerequisites

- Strict prerequisite of Maths Methods for Direct Pathway to Engineering
- Music requires Music ATAR or AMEB 5
- For all other majors, where a prerequisite is indicated, students can enter into the major and make up the subject at university

Student with no maths: MATH1720 in first year


Student with Maths Applications: ECON1111 in first year
