

All students applying to undertake the unit [SOCS5911 Fieldwork in Complex and Hostile Places](#) must complete this form in order to be considered for a place in the unit.

Overview

SOCS5911 is 12 credit unit run intensively over seven days from 27 June-3 July 2019, consisting of four days of classroom-based seminars at UWA's Crawley campus and three days in a scenario/simulation learning environment at [Camp Bickley](#), Orange Grove, Perth. The unit is delivered by UWA in partnership with the [Global Centre of Research & Engagement](#) (GCORE).

It is relevant to both researchers and others planning to work 'in the field', including in non-research roles. The unit covers research methods, risk management, field skills as well as immersive scenarios and virtual reality simulations to prepare students for working with vulnerable participants and for extended periods of fieldwork in less secure, complex and hostile environments.

The two written assessments for the unit will be due in the weeks after the intensive teaching.

In addition, students can undertake UN Department of Safety and Security-accredited online training modules, such as Basic and Advanced Security In The Field, Information Security Awareness and Preparing and Responding to Active Shooter Incidents, to obtain UNDDS certification.

SOCS5911 can be taken as a stand-alone 12-credit unit, or taken as the core unit as part of the new 24-credit [Graduate Certificate in Fieldwork Practice](#). Students completing the Graduate Certificate are eligible to articulate with credit into the [Master of Social Research Methods](#) should they wish to do so.
